**Please provide a brief description of these specific factors (500 word limit):**

There was a 22 percent decrease in the number of sheltered people experiencing homelessness between the night-of-the-count in 2021 (58) and 2022 (45). The reduction is attributable to the response by service providers to the COVID-19 pandemic and limited emergency shelter capacity. Before the number of coronavirus cases began to increase in January of 2022, the Counties, CoC Administrative Entity, and other service providers were issuing fewer hotel motel vouchers for people experiencing or at imminent risk of homelessness and testing positive for or exposed to COVID-19. The Administrative Entity also experienced a fiscal crisis at this time which resulted in a significant decrease in the number of hotel/motel vouchers issued for the night-of-the-count in 2022.

Alpine, Inyo, Mono Counties CoC experienced a 41 percent decrease in the number of unsheltered people experiencing homelessness (PEH) between the night-of-the-count in 2020 (162) (last unsheltered count) and 2022 (95). The reasons for this reduction are the reduced capacity of service providers responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and a 105 percent increase in the number of sheltered PEH between 2020 (22) and 2022 (45). In addition, service providers believe that the weather was also a factor in the unsheltered count this year. It was extremely cold throughout the region on the night-of-the-count and PEH sought shelter on their own and stayed with friends and relatives or in a hotel.
